### Elk Hair Caddis (Brown)

Hook: Standard Dry 12-18

Thread: Brown

Body: Brown Dubbing

Hackle: Brown Palmered

Wing: Light Elk or Substitute

Rib: X-Fine Gold Wire



### Caddis Emerger

Hook: Scud Hook size 14-18

Thread: Olive 8/0

Body: Olive Dubbing or Antron

Hackle: Partridge for legs, sparse

Wing: Dark Deer Hair

Head: Peacock Herl
