Fall Classes Are Starting

Very little is more satisfying than hooking a trout on a fly, particularly a fly that you've tied yourself. Members of the Main Line Fly Tyers are involved in teaching fly tying classes through a couple of different programs. Both classes are set up to instruct to beginner and intermediate tyers. The class at Upper Moreland also teaches to an advanced level.

At both locations, first timers will be shown equipment, materials, and some techniques the first night and will be tying flies in the second class. Through the courses, even experienced tyers can gain new insights to raise their craft to a new level. So, if you are just starting out, or are already an avid tyer, why not consider signing up for one of these courses.

Sam Vigorita and Dave Shillington conduct a class thru the Upper Moreland Parks and Recreation program in Willow Grove PA. This class meets beginning September 23rd for six Thursday nights (thru October 28th) from 7pm-9pm. Course fee is 47.00. Registration can be done through the Upper Moreland website: uppermoreland.org/departments/parks/recreation.aspx or by contacting the Parks and Recreation office at (215) 659-3100 x1039 Ed Emery and Mike Ebner conduct their class



on Tuesday nights thru the Lower Providence Parks and Recreation program in Eagleville PA. That program starts on October 19th and runs for six Tuesday nights thru November 23rd. It's a two hour class beginning at 7:15pm. The cost is 42.00 for resident and 52.00 for non-resident. Also, Sam Vigorita teaches a Fly Fishing Tactics course thru the Upper Moreland Parks and Recreation Program. Learn strategies to improve your fly fishing skills. The course also covers topics such as selecting and organizing your gear. Even experienced anglers will come away having learned something new through this class. Use the contact information mentioned earlier in this article to sign up for this course.

As stated above there are fees for these courses. A portion of the fee goes towards the organizations/facilities hosting the programs. The part paid to the instructors, which are all MLFT members, have always been graciously donated back to the club. Members signing up and taking the courses help to support club.

Recently the EPA was petitioned by several conservation groups to ban the use of lead in ammunition and fishing tackle. The petition was rejected with regards to ammunition, but the EPA is still reviewing the issue

related to fishing tackle.

Please take a moment at the next meeting to stop by and introduce yourself to Rick and thank him for stepping up to help out the club.

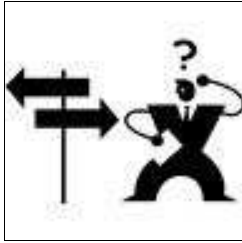


Tyers Wanted

From Pennsylvania Turnpike (I-276)

Take Exit 333 (Norristown - old exit 25). At the end of the ramp, turn left onto Plymouth Road. At the light, turn right onto Germantown Pike West. Continue approximately one (1) mile, through four (4) traffic lights (not counting the left hand turn light at Sandy Hill Road). At the fifth light, turn right onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.

From Blue Route (I-476)

Take exit for Germantown Pike West (Exit 20). Continue on Germantown Pike west for approximately one (1) mile, through five (5) traffic lights (not counting the left hand turn light at Sandy Hill Road). At the fifth light, turn right onto Jolly Road. The Community Center is on the right at 2910 Jolly Road.
